

When to dial 211, 911, and 988?

211 Connections to community resources, emotional support, and crisis intervention

911 Emergencies: medical, fire, and police

988 Crisis: mental health, substance use, and suicide

More Than 988: Future Plans for HB 1477

Support for people in crisis can't end with a phonecall. HB1477 goes beyond the establishment of 988.

Someone to Call

The establishment of a 24/7, easy-to-remember 988 lifeline gives people a reliable place to call for support during a crisis.

Someone to Respond

988 calls reach trained counselors. Specific lifelines will support groups at higher risk of suicide, including American Indian people and veterans.

A Place to Go

Future technological improvements will provide operators with real-time information from service providers to help arrange follow-up care for callers.
